Candidates' Forum outcome

On March 14 we heard candidates from all parties state their commitments to protection for Narrabeen Lagoon and its catchment. Now is the time for the newly elected Members of Parliament to honour their promises. Pittwater MP Rob Stokes tells us he will be writing to the Minister for Lands (the Hon Greg Pearce MLC), requesting arrangements to proclaim Narrabeen State Park commence. Brad Hazzard and Jonathan O'Dea, also keen advocates, are expected to follow suit.

Oxford Falls - Plan of Management

The Plan of Management for Oxford Falls Regional Crown Reserve is now ready to go to the Minister for sign off. However, this will be delayed until after Easter because of the change of Government and the probable changes to the Land and Property Management Authority. The Plan calls for balancing provision for recreation with the need for environmental protection.

The Narrabeen Lagoon Walkway or Multi-use Trail Project is a 2.5km trail between Deep Creek and South Creek to complete the circuit with the existing walkway from South Creek via Berry Reserve and Bilarong Reserve to Deep Creek.

The Warringah Council website provides good detail of the plan and suggests that Stage 1 - the trail between Deep and Middle Creek (850m) - is expected to be completed by mid 2011. The construction of a new pedestrian bridge to provide pedestrians and cyclists with safe passage to walk and ride this section of the lagoon away from the busy Wakehurst Parkway, is to be managed by Pittwater Council and due for completion in 2011.

Stage 2A plan - upgrade of Middle Creek Reserve is up for comment now with work expected to begin early in 2012. The toilet block upgrade is underway.

Warringah Council will publish a number of options for public comment on Stage 2B in early May.

Final stages of \$1.9m Grant

Thanks to the hardworking Grant Project Officers, the final report of the very successful Urban Sustainability Grant is nearing completion.

Some 60ha of weed infested bushland areas have been treated but most of them need ongoing works to maintain the gains that have been made. Small grants have been secured but more must be found.

One good outcome has been new bushcare groups particularly near Mullet and Nareen Creeks. Many thanks to those volunteers who will keep up the good work with help from Pittwater Council.
