26 Black Swans were seen in the southwest basin in January. "Know your birds" author Louise Egerton tells us they feed on weeds below the surface. The weed needs clear water to photosynthesise and grow, and the water must be shallow enough for the swans to reach down to it with their long necks. No weed, no swans. Thanks to all "keepers of the environment" whose efforts are enabling swans to return to Narrabeen Lagoon.

You need to write to the Dept of Planning **before June 28** stating whether you think these laws will provide adequate environmental protection for NSW. #### Free – bushwalks and a kayak trip

#### Cromer Circle Bushwalk – Sun April 21
