### The Most Exciting News EVER!

Metropolitan Local Aboriginal Land Council (MLALC) is the owner of the largest area of natural bushland in the catchment of Narrabeen Lagoon. MLALC has proposed for this land to be leased and managed as Gai-mariagal National Park under Part 4A of the National Parks and Wildlife Act of NSW.

The land shares a long boundary with Garigal National Park and it is proposed that it will be managed as one large National Park with particular acknowledgement of the significant Aboriginal heritage values of the area.

Friends originally wanted the Crown Land in the catchment to become National Park but because this was not possible at the time, we have been lobbying for it to be gazetted as Narrabeen State Park. The new proposal is far more appealing—i.e. that the crown land be amalgamated with MLALC land and managed as one large National Park.

#### Local Environment Plan comments due

Warringah Council invites comments on the long-awaited plans for the deferred areas of the Local Environment Plan.

With the proposal from Metropolitan Local Aboriginal Land Council to create a National Park over most of their land and all of the Crown Land, the proposed E3 rating for the current B2 area is not appropriate—this land must be zoned E1 and managed as a National Park.
