More hedging on the dredging

On Dec 17 Warringah Council voted that the three favoured options for dredging in the Lagoon be available for public comment with the results to go to a Council meeting in March 2014. The report stated that, because there is no funding for dredging until at least 2017-18, the ecological studies will need to be repeated because, by then, they will be out of date.

What a shame the money could not be borrowed now so the work could be completed before extra studies were needed — would the cost of borrowing money equal or be less than the cost of repeating the studies?

Michael Bucknell was not content with the finding that a fence separating traffic from pedestrians on Narrabeen Bridge—where Pittwater Rd crosses the Lagoon—would be expensive and need all the concrete blocks lifted. He took a photo showing where the fence supports could be located with each one directly above a bridge pylon that is fixed to the bed of the Lagoon. Rob Stokes, MP, took this information to the Minister who approved this cheaper option.

Narrabeen State Park — approved

Finally, we are to have Narrabeen State Park declared albeit over a much smaller area than we had envisaged. The reduction is because most of the crown land proposed for the State Park is now under claim by the Metropolitan Local Aboriginal Land Council who propose that it be incorporated into Gai-mariagal National Park.

Narrabeen State Park will incorporate the Lagoon itself plus crown lands around its perimeter such as Berry Reserve, Jamieson Park, South Creek Reserve, the Multi-purpose trail and Middle Creek Reserve.

Friends has asked that the Multi-purpose trail be named "Somerville Circuit" to recognize the considerable contribution Jim Somerville made towards getting it done.
