Wildlife Walk report from January 20, 2018

At 7:45am our group of eager participants headed off up Deep Creek, along the Caleyi Trail, named after the Critically Endangered *Grevillea caleyi* that grows near the head of the trail. We passed through Bangalay floodplain woodland initially finding a great assortment of bird species including several migratory species such as Dollarbirds, Channel-Billed Cuckoo and White-throated Needletail - a species which can fly without landing for an entire year!

As we headed further upstream the vegetation changed to a more sheltered community with *Callicoma serratifolia*, *Melaleuca ericifolia* and *Acmena smithii* now dominating. A Hyacinth Orchid next to the track was still flowering and was a new species for all participants! Leaving the Caleyi trail and heading up along an unnamed creek we found an Eastern Water Dragon basking on a large sandstone rock. We then spotted 2 Sydney Spiny Crayfish which were approximately 50+ years old! This species requires clean water to live and breed in and is a testament to the water quality in Garigal National Park.

Finally, as we headed back to the cars Jayden spotted a Yellow-faced Whipsnake basking on the track, a first record for the Deep Creek valley. Further along, a small group of Leaden Flycatchers was found feeding alongside a Whiteeared Honeyeater, another species which is very rarely reported from the valley but common on the heathland ridges. Overall, it was a great morning of wildlife spotting and we're looking forward to the next one!
